Field Trips Enhance Learning at West Branch School

Field trips play an important role in student learning at West Branch School. Throughout the year, students have the opportunity to go on a variety of field trips that extend what is being learned at school or provide new and enjoyable experiences! Recently, both the upstairs (3rd – 6th grades) and downstairs students (Kindergarten – 2nd grades) went on separate field trips. The upstairs students visited the Waterdale Lodge. While there, the students participated in a creek study, learned about invasive aquatics, and toured the water treatment plant. The students had a great time and learned interesting and new information. One student even realized an immediate application to his own life. When asked about the field trip, fifth grader Garreth Watts responded, "Waterdale was awesome! We learned about many invasive plants, which helped me because I had some in the garden."

On the same day, the downstairs students hiked through nearby Rider Park. In addition to enjoying the beautiful surroundings, the students



worked in small groups to identify insects, flowers, trees, and more. Teacher Colleen Winton commented, "It is so impressive to see such young students using real field guides to identify things in nature."

Some of the other field trip locations this year included Camp Susque, Bald Eagle State Park, Carpenter's Farm, the Bloomsburg Theatre Ensemble, Washington, D.C., and the Williamsport YMCA for swimming lessons. At WBS, field trips don't represent a break from learning; they are an integral part of student learning and growth. Part of the school's educational philosophy states that the school

will provide a variety of learning experiences, including opportunities to capitalize on spontaneous learning moments and draw connections between academic content and the real world. 

LAZY HAZY DAYS OF SUMMER

Remembering Old Jackson Playground

One of my favorite pastimes when I was a kid was spending my summer days at Old Jackson Playground which buzzed with activity for all ages. As a kindergartener I staked out a corner in the sandbox underneath the big shade tree taking all morning to build towns and roads for my little cars.

Bigger kids played tag on the square metal monkey bars, or rode on the merry go round with someone in the middle pushing it to spin as fast as possible. Other play equipment included wooden see-saws, big swings and a very tall slide. Occasionally someone waxed the aluminum board so that riders practically flew to the bottom.

As I grew older I arrived early in the morning to pick up litter and sweep the blacktop so that I could be one of the first to play Nok Hockey, a board game for two players. The object was to score points by using a curved stick and shooting a puck into one of the slots at either end of the board. Long lines formed to play on one of the two boards so being first was a definite advantage.

Another line formed for Foursquare, a game played with a ball by 4 players each standing in a numbered square. The player in square one served the ball to another player who hit it to someone else. An out, either missing the ball or hitting it outside of the squares, meant being sent to the back of the line.

Old Jackson had their own version called "Six-square", which wasn't a square at all but a circle. The variation came about because the blacktop always flooded after a rain storm so the game was moved to the round sprinkler which was divided into 6 pie sections. A playground supervisor decided to paint a circle on the blacktop so that Six-square could be played even if it hadn't rained.

Really hot days the sprinkler was turned on and everyone ran home for their swimming suits to splash about in the cool spray. Once a week was the comic books swap, kids trading their old comics for ones that were needed for their collection. Another weekly event was crafts. Popsicle sticks, bottle caps or broken pottery became beautiful works of art for our parents. Suddenly it was August and school clothes shopping was upon us. The playground closed, leaving only the sweet memories of the lazy, hazy days of summer.


